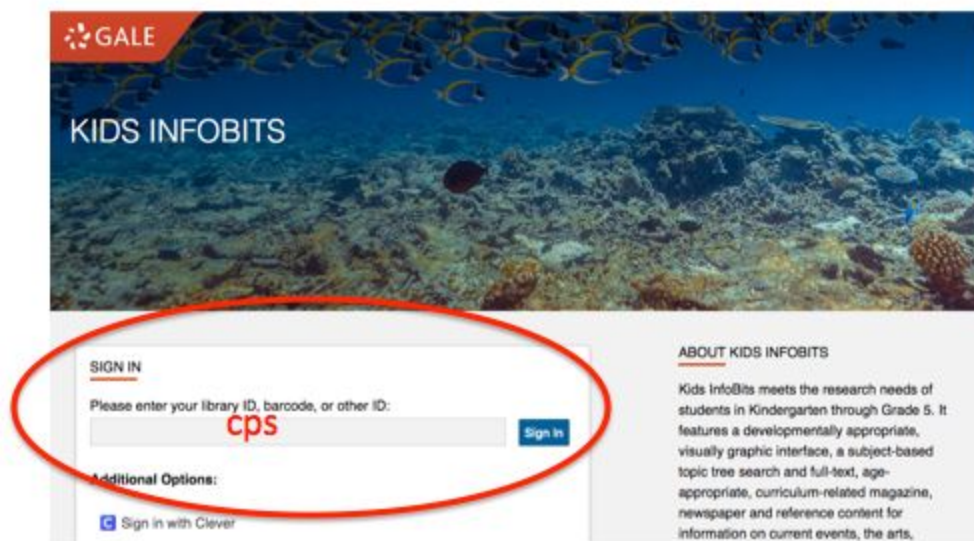

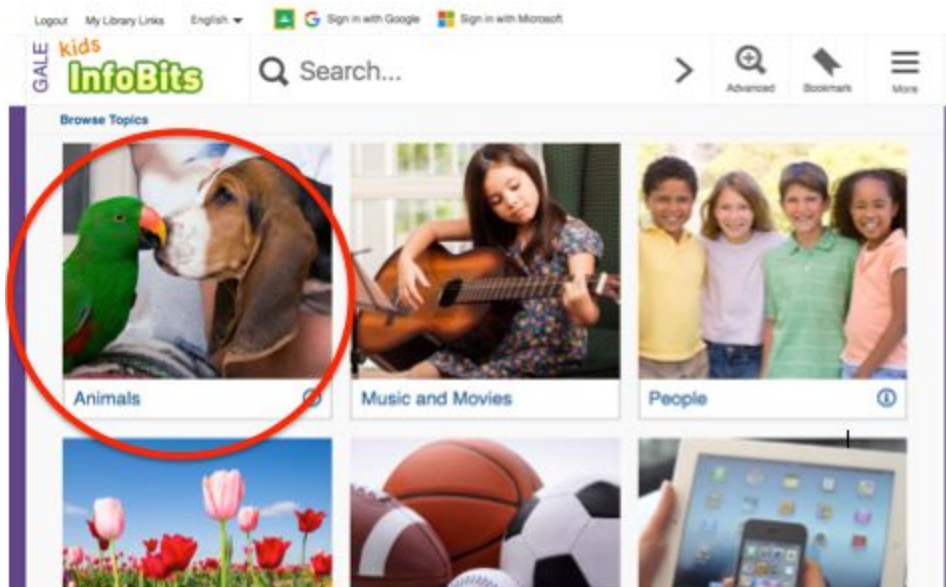

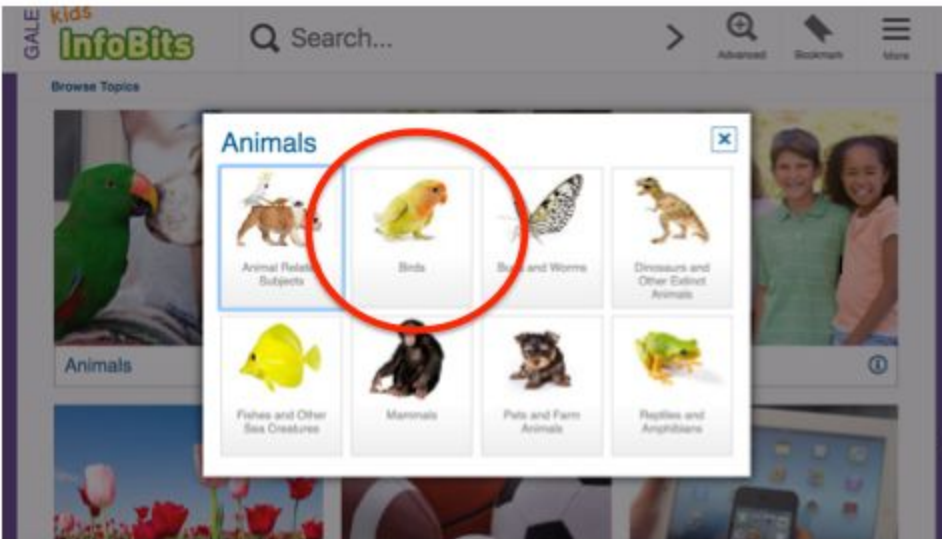
At the Sign In screen, type in **cps**



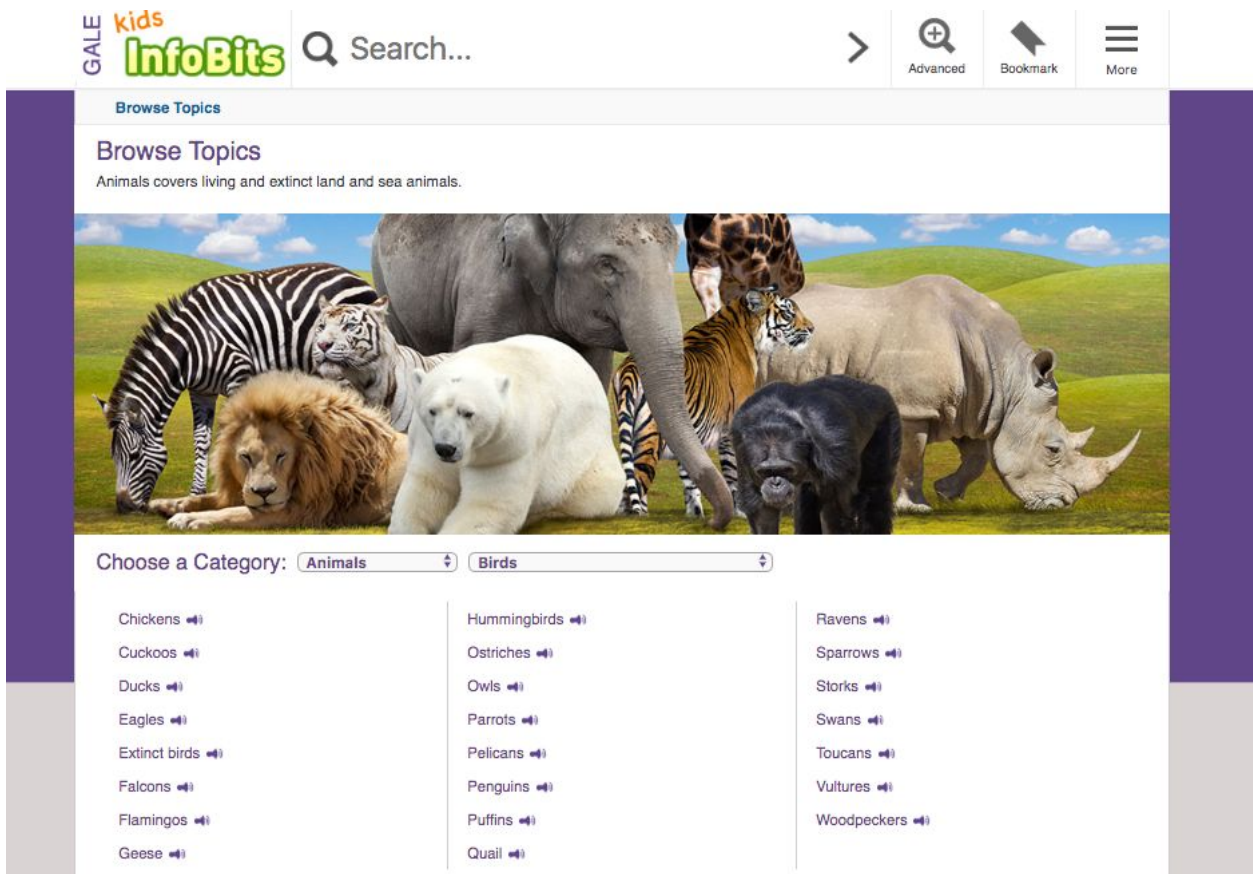
Click on **Animals**.



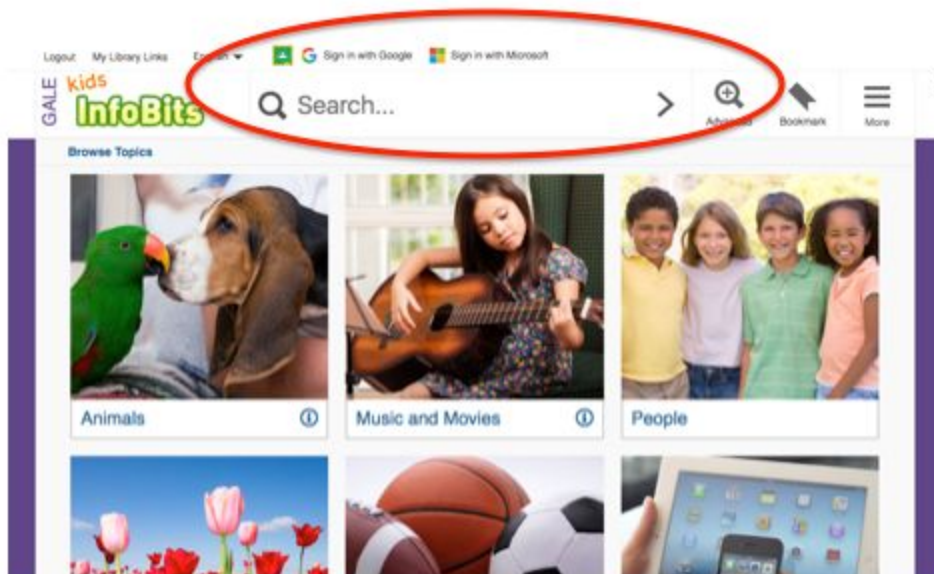
Click on **Birds**.



Click on a bird you are interested in learning more about from the list.

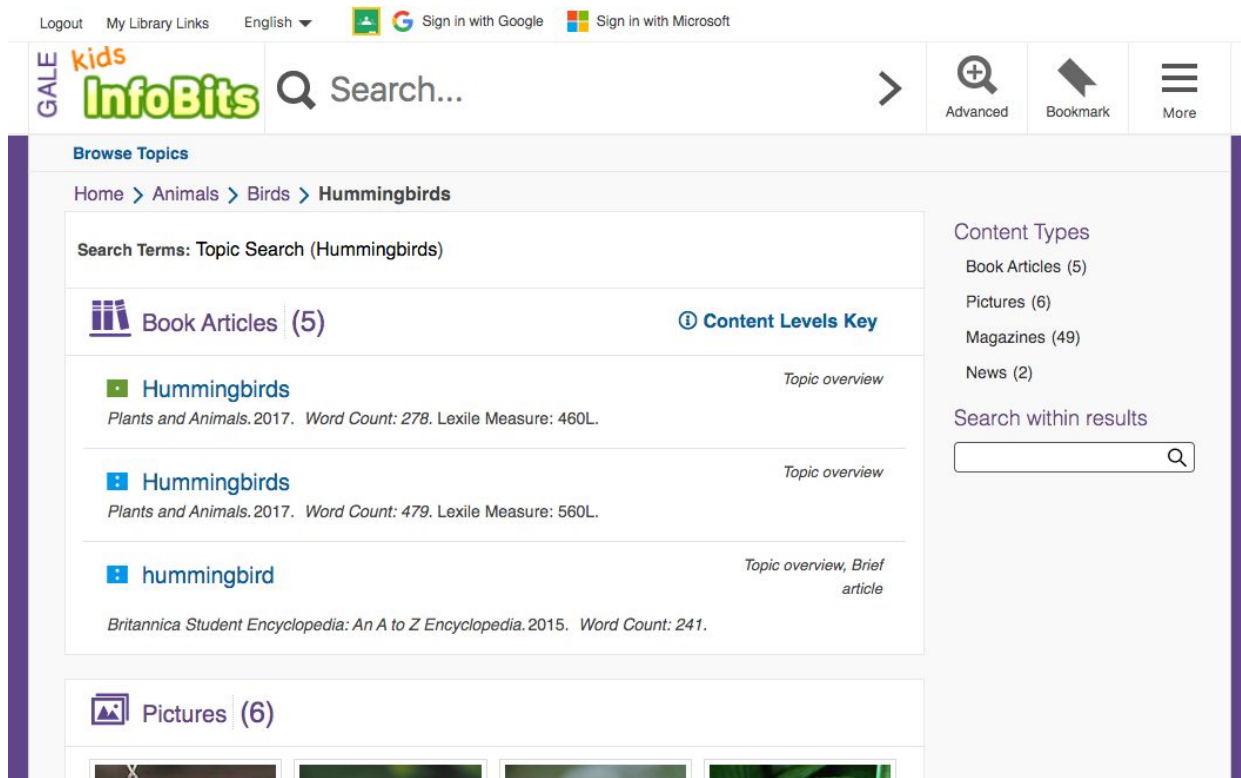


If a bird you are interested in is not on the list, type a bird (ex. robins) in the **Search Box**.



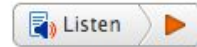
Click on the name of the bird (blue text) found under **Book Articles** (will be first).
